Keao NeSmith is a lecturer of Hawaiian in the Hawaiian and Indo-Pacific Languages and Literatures Department at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa (UHM). He teaches all levels of Hawaiian language. In 2000-2001, he spent a year teaching Hawaiian at the University of French Polynesia in Tahiti, and later also taught Tahitian language at UHM (2002-2003).

Mr. NeSmith received his MA in Pacific Islands Studies at UHM in Dec 2002 with the thesis *TuTu's Hawaiian and the Emergence of a Neo-Hawaiian Language*. He plans to pursue his Ph.D. under Prof. Winifred Crombie in the School of Maori and Pacific Development at the University of Waikato in Hamilton, NZ. He will be starting the program in the Fall of 2007.
