

Some information on housing that we have collected over the years

1. Probably the best place on campus for graduate students to live is the **East-West Center**. It is right across the street from the Department of Linguistics and close to the library. The contact address is:

New applicants need a letter of recommendation. They also need to interview with Sister before a decision is made. Applicants should be financially secure, but they don't need to be Catholic or otherwise religious.

Rent is currently \$375/month, and there's a \$150 deposit. Rooms are fairly large singles with basic furnishings and a sink. Kitchen and bathroom facilities are shared, cooking utensils are provided, and coin laundry facilities are available on each floor. The building is secured after school hours. The hall is no smoking, and no male visitors are allowed.
